


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Casa Italiana Zerilli-Marimò at NYU to host Bellocchio's *Kidnapped* and a tribute to Giordana's *The Best of Youth* in its 20th anniversary as part of Italy On Screen Today NY film fest. Italian movie stars Sonia Bergamasco and Fabrizio Gifuni among the special guests



NEW YORK (December 4, 2023) - "Never like this year, the movies selected for <u>Italy On Screen</u> <u>Today New York</u> uniquely reflect the tensions, problems and contradictions of Italian society," states **Stefano Albertini, Director of** <u>Casa Italiana Zerilli-Marimò at New York University</u>, proud of hosting **the eighth edition of Italy on Screen Today - New York Film & TV Series Fest**, a cinematic festival directed and curated by Loredana Commonara.

The festival is set to showcase the pinnacle of contemporary Italian cinema and TV series. It is a week-long celebration (December 4-10, 2023) featuring live events in Manhattan and online on Mymovies.it. The screenings scheduled at Casa Italiana NYU (24 West 12th Street) will take place on December 6 and 8 and, apart from the festival's opening movie "Io Capitano" by

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Matteo Garrone, they are the only ones in person offering the opportunity to meet directors and actors. Journalist Silvia Bizio will moderate all Q&As.

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"In particular, this year it is an honor for us to screen films with a strong narrative impact such as *Kidnapped* by Bellocchio," continues Albertini, "and it is a pleasure to welcome on our stage famous Italian actors of great talent such as Fabrizio Gifuni and Sonia Bergamasco who are among the protagonists of *The Best of Youth*, Marco Tullio Giordana's masterpiece that celebrates its twentieth anniversary this year."

This festival has captured the hearts of Americans who relish the finest Italian cinema and TV series showcased by this festival in New York, and every year, Casa Italiana has been a partner and venue for it.

Expressing her gratitude, the festival's director, Loredana Commonara, said: "We are very grateful to Director Albertini to be able to renew the prestigious collaboration with New York University by returning to the elegant rooms of Casa Italiana Zerilli-Marimò. Thinking about the program for Casa's attentive and prepared public is always challenging. That's why we thought about a diversified offering with two featured movies and several shorts this time."

The festival at Casa Italiana will open on December 6, at 6 pm, with the 22-minute-long movie *The External Gaze* (Lo sguardo esterno), the intimate monologue of an elderly director about to shoot her latest documentary. Director Peter Marcias will briefly introduce his short movie (US premiere). The highlight of the evening will be Marco Bellocchio's last movie, *Kidnapped* (Rapito), previously showcased in competition at the Cannes Film Festival. This historical drama, based on true events and awarded Best Film at the Italian Golden Globes (Globi d'Oro 2023), narrates the story of a young boy whose abduction from his parents by the Vatican fuelled outrage in 19th-century Italy. The Guardian described it as "a full-tilt melodrama with the passionate vehemence of Victor Hugo or Charles Dickens."

The program on December 8 is vibrant. The evening starts at 5:30 pm with *Unfitting* (US premiere), written and directed by Giovanna Mezzogiorno. In only 9 minutes, the Italian actress, Media Contact:

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famous for L'Ultimo bacio (2001) by Gabriele Muccino, among other movies, describes her own experience of weight gain after giving birth to her twins and the subsequent ostracism by the movie industry, more interested in her aesthetics than talents. It will be followed by the feature *Mixed by Erry*, directed by Sydney Sibilia. The movie, based on a true story, is about the rise

and fall of the pirate mixtape empire of three brothers from Naples and their "Mixed by Erry"trademarked cassettes that brought pop music to 1980s Italian youth. To follow: *Due mondi separati* (US Premiere) by Marianna Sciveres, plus a Q&A with actor Lucia Sardo. The evening will close with the highly anticipated celebration of the 20th anniversary of *La meglio gioventù*, Marco Tullio Giordana's seminal coming-of-age film that marked a milestone in Italian cinema of the new millennium. The protagonists, Sonia Bergamasco and Fabrizio Gifuni (he also starred in Kidnapped and Mixed by Erry), will engage in a special conversation during which they will be honored with the Italy on Screen Excellence Award.
